


Dear Analytical Grammar user:

After chatting with several of our other customers, we decided it would be useful for you to have a quick, measurable way for you to see how our program is working for your students. With this in mind, we wrote this 30-question test to use as both a pre-test and a post-test.



The test is divided into three sections, one for each season in the book. We recommend you have your students take the entire test before starting the first unit of AG. If you go through the entire program in one year, have them take the entire test again after completing the program.

If you break the program into seasons, you can give just that season's test to the students after completion. For example (and this is just one of many different ways the test can be used):

6th grade –
Pre-test (all 30 questions)
Season One of AG
Season One post-test (just the first 10 questions)

7th grade –
Season Two of AG
Season Two post-test (just questions 11-20)

8th grade –
Season Three of AG
Season Three post-test (either the whole thing or the last 10 questions)

Although the AG program is open-note, it's important that this test be closed-note. For those who use the units in a different order than the three seasons, feel free to change and move the questions around in a way that will work for you. When given as a pre-test, go ahead and let the students know how they scored, but don't allow them to see the test and the correct answers. We don't want to skew the post-test in any way.

We hope this set of questions will be helpful for you. We're, of course, interested in how AG is working for you and your test results will be of great interest to us. E-mail us with your results!
